The FCC has decided to make permanent the rule requiring commercial made amateur amplifiers to be type accepted. The commission has also decided to release a further notice of proposed rule making, Docket 21117, looking toward allowing manufacturers of amplifiers to supply amateurs with instructions on how to modify the amplifiers for use on 10 meters. 


COMMERCIAL EXAM INFO

COAXIAL CABLE HINT

When connecting coax fittings outside where they will be exposed to the
weather, fill the connectors with
silicon grease to prevent water from
getting in the joint. The best method
we have seen yet is to use the type
that comes in an injector - sort of
like a hypo needle. Most local suppliers carry them.
