

Old Business - The upcoming trip to the ARRL and the dual-band radio raffle were discussed. The trip to the ARRL shall be by carpool. A motion sanctioning club involvement in the YMCA event at the Children's Museum was passed.

New Business - The following motions were made and passed:

- 3. Motion to purchase grass seed for yard (\$50).







After the extensive tour of the Headquarters build-




DAVE DEAN IN THE OSL SORTING ROOM





"The glass is half empty."




ENGINEER

TECHNICAL TIPS

- For extra security when using plastic ties, leave a little stub of plastic protruding from the latch end and melt it down with a soldering iron.
- Extend the life of lamps used in old equipment by adding a small resistor in series with the feed. Applying 11 volts to a lamp instead of 12 volts extends the life about 50%!
- Turn any nut into a captive nut by covering the nut and the threads that extend out of the nut with hot glue from a glue gun.
- 4. Screw stuck on a knob? Give it a good shot of vibration from a vibrating engraver tool! Be sure to do this before you bugger-up the screw slot with excessive torque.
