


The following motions were made and passed:






MEMBERSHIP ON THE RISE



## UNDERSTANDING ENGINEERS



The doctor chimed in, "I don't know, but I've never seen such ineptitude!" The pastor said, "Hey, here comes the greenskeeper. Let's have a word with him. Hi George. Say, what's with that group ahead of us? They're rather slow, aren't they?" The greenskeeper replied, "Oh, yes, that's a group of blind firefighters. They lost their sight saving our clubhouse from a fire last year, so we always let them play for free anytime." The group was silent for a moment. The pastor said, "That's so sad. I think I will say a special prayer for them tonight." The doctor said, "Good idea. And I'm going to contact my ophthalmologist buddy and see if there's anything he can do for them."

The engineer said, "Why can't these guys play at night?"

#### TECHNICAL TIPS

All mobile radios face severe noise and transients on the 12 volt power source used to run the radio. The best way to limit such noise is by connecting the radio DIRECTLY to the battery with a heavy cable.

Bad grounding of the battery to the car's chassis will cause noise in the radio's speaker (whine) when the headlamps are turned on, and wreak havoc when the engine is cranked. Most often the problem is a poor connection of the battery negative ground lead to the chassis. (The heavy cable goes to the engine block, and the smaller cable grounds the chassis, usually at the fender.) The cure: replace the tapping screw normally used to secure the ground lead to the chassis with a nut, bolt and lock-washer combination.
