EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS EXERCISE HELD FEBRUARY 8TH

n Saturday, February 8, 2003, an ARES Emergency Communications Exercise was held from 10 am to 1 pm throughout Southeastern Massachusetts. The exercise was held to check the operational status and ability of amateurs to hold effective communications during a disaster.

In addition to the local SEMARA/ SEMCARES Team, participants in the event included the National Weather Service in Taunton, Greater New Bedford Red Cross, Marshfield EOC and Civil Air Patrol (CAP), Sturdy Memorial EMCOMM Team, Bridgewater EOC/Massasoit ARA Emergency Response Team, and the Fall River BCRA Emergency Response Team.

area were established on both high frequency (HF) and very-high frequency (VHF) bands. The HF communications were on 40 meters, while VHF operations were held on 6 and 2 meters. The exercise revealed several deficiencies in the local system that will corrected ASAP. One of the findings was the requirement for a 2 meter base station with CTCCS tone capability. The lack of such capability pre-

vented communications via the Taunton 2 meter repeater. Also, the lack of a 6 meter antenna at the club prevented use of that frequency.

The following members staffed the club during the exercise: Scott, W1EV; Bill, W1POW; Carl, K1KID; Jerry, KB1JGA; Bill, K1IBR; Andy, WA1FNM; Pete, KB1GPL; Ray, KB1EVX. Checking into the exercise from their home stations were John, W1ZYV; Arthur, W1TGA; Al, WB1FQP; Dick, K1AHA; Mike, KB1NB, and Bob, N1BLF.

The exercise was a great learning experience for all, and we look forward to the next emergency communications test. By the way, kale soup and steamers were served during the exercise at the club in addition to the usual coffee and donuts!





THE EARLY DAYS OF RADIO



Bedford sent in by Art Marshall, W1FJI. This is the station of Milton Baylies, 1ZN, of 111 Grinnell street. The picture was taken in September of 1915 by photographer Everett L. Weeden of 64 Bay Street, New Bedford.

On the left side of the table is the 750 watt, 20,000 volt spark transmitter used by Milt. The motor driven rotary spark gap in front of the 20,000 volt transformer appears to be set on a towel to dampen vibrations. In the center of the table is the receiver with the headphones lying in front of it. Prominently displayed above the table is Milt's First Grade wireless radio operators license. Note the picture of a lighthouse to the lower left of the license.

In 1912 Milt was a local celebrity when he copied messages from the Cunard Lines ship S.S. Carpithia documenting the rescue efforts at sea following the sinking of the Titanic. The local newspaper, the Evening Standard, stationed a reporter at Milt's house to relay the rescue reports to the newspaper as fast as Milt received them.

The meeting adjourned at 8:07 pm.


IRLP SWAP NET Channel 9255




This is the year of new calls! It seems one or two members get a new call each month. Best of OSOs with your new call, Hugh.

Amateur Radio Communications at the Boston Marathon

Radio operators are making preparations to support the 107th running of the Boston Athletic Association Boston Marathon on April 21, 2002. Amateur Radio plays a vital part in supporting runners before, during, and after the marathon. This year we have a combined organization handling all phases of radio support; start area, length of the course, and finish line.


Positions are available starting early in the day in Hopkinton, along the route at aid and water stations, and at finish line operations in Boston. You can chose which activity you will be involved with, or work multiple locations. In Hopkington, we will assist with coordinating the multiple parking areas and providing for start line safety. Along the 26 mile route, assisting the Red Cross at aid stations with supply requirements and ambulance dispatch. Runner pick up busses traveling the route will have hams on board. At the finish line, working with the medical teams and shadowing officials. You will need a two meter or dual band HT, extended antenna, and extra batteries for participation. Procedure sheets will be available before the event. We will try to accommodate your needs within the confines of the event set up.

To signup mail in the BAA volunteer form available at the baa web site (http://www.baa.org). You can find the volunteer form by clicking B.A.A Marathon under B.A.A. Volunteering then click GENERAL VOLUNTEER APPLICATION. Fill it out and mail it in as instructed. Check in the Race Day section: if you want to work the start check radio team; if you want to work the finish check ham radio (finish only); and if you want to work the course check ham radio (course only). We will be doing a mailing at the end of Feb. with more details. You will be able to change your mind at that time as well. 

RAY ARRUDA GIVES TALK ON MW DXING


Ray Arruda, KB1EVX, gave a very interesting Tech-Talk on medium wave (MW) Dxing. MW Dxing refers to logging broadcast band stations. Ray has heard stations from all states except Alaska, Hawaii, and Oregon. Additionally, he has logged many broadcast stations in Europe and South America.

Ray had several three-ring binders that contained his confirmation letters from stations all over the world. He mentioned that one station also

sent him a baseball type cap with the station's call letters on it! Ray stressed the need to include a self-addressed, self-stamped envelope when requesting confirmation reports.

Ray revealed several "secrets" that he used to snag stations far away. One mentioned was that stations periodically go off the air for maintenance and this allows you to hear other stations far away. (Years ago most stations shut down at midnight Sunday evening for maintenance.)

It was a great talk and the 20 members in attendance truly enjoyed it. *Thanks*, *Ray!*
