97 rules governing the Amateur Radio Service. The new rules would provide that, under certain limited conditions, Amateur Radio operators may transmit messages during emergency and disaster preparedness drills, regardless of whether the operators are employees of entities participating in the drill. [Such operations are currently not permitted.]

On April 22, a summary of the NPRM was published in the Federal Register and the FCC is seeking comments on it **filed on or before May 24**, 2010. related issue: agencies using Amateur Radio Operators (and our spectrum) for communications that should be conducted on their FCC assigned frequencies. The problem is the precedent of using our spectrum as an excuse to gobble up amateur spectrum. As usual, we are caught between a rock and a hard place: use it or lose it—but don't abuse it. A case in point was a recent request by a RI agency to have hams assess the flood damage for them in the state. There is no problem with hams driving around and observing. The problem is it is 'easier' to use hams who provide their own equipment (and gas) while we willingly put our Amateur Radio Service at risk. Note the survey was not an emergency that could not be accomplished any other way.

ay is a busy month. Since it is supposed to bring flowers, it follows that it will also bring tall grass to be cut, etc.





Also, the two meter repeater antenna appears to have a water issue and is causing crunchy noise. The antenna has been tested and the problem confirmed. This antenna must be repaired before June 1st so that it may be used for the RACES net.

**Rick (W1RJC)** reported that the 900 MHZ repeater controller will be installed and the IRLP will also be installed soon. The components have been received.

### **New Business**

Marcel (W1MLD) read a letter that we received from the Dartmouth Police Department requesting the placement of a receiving antenna at the top of the tower in our space. There was considerable discussion and a motion was made and seconded to allow the antenna with several stipulations. Those will be approved by the BOD prior to sending the approval letter. The vote of the members was 23 for, 3 opposed. Motion passed.

**Rick** (W1RJC) brought up a request from Fairhaven EMA for a utility pole to be donated to them for mounting antennas. We do have several spare utility poles and a motion was made and seconded to donate one pole to the Fairhaven EMA. The members voted unanimously.
