

Did you know we are an ARRL affiliated club? The implies that at least fifty percent of our members are ARRL members, too. It is gratifying that the last few members to join SEMARA are Life members, as I am. I looked at it as a good investment in amateur radio.

One of the first things that I was looking for was the kind of help that that ARRL offered when I was starting out - code practice transmissions. Of course, you needed a copy of QST to check the copy (sneaky marketing, eh?). That was OK with me as I liked the mix of technical articles in QST. The other thing that attracted me was the attention that the ARRL paid attention to the attacks on the amateur bands. You see, I was licensed just as the 11-meter band was reallocated as an HF Citizens Band service. Even today, if you tune the low end of 10meters and below, you will run into the so-called "HFers" running LSB and lots of power. These pirates needed to be paid attention to by all of us, not only the CW operators who are being interfered with. That's why I support the ARRL's Frequency Defense efforts
